

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF
THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF ARAB, ALABAMA
MARCH 5, 2018**

The City Council of the City of Arab, Alabama, met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. for its regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, March 5, 2018, in Arab City Hall, the time and place scheduled for such meeting.

Mayor Bob Joslin called the meeting to order. Upon roll call, the following answered present:

Also present were Tony Willis (City Clerk), Summer Bixler (Administrative Assistant), Rodney Edmondson (City Attorney), representatives of the media, and the public.

Mayor Joslin declared a quorum present and opened the meeting for the transaction of business. Council Member Allen led the pledge of allegiance. The invocation was given by Council Member Gullion.

The minutes of the February 20, 2018, regular meeting were approved by unanimous vote upon a motion made by Council Member Allen and seconded by Council Member Harper.

Mayor Joslin then moved to staff reports. The Mayor reported that Arab won the City Feud County-wide event which was a fundraiser for Home Place. Tony Willis then reminded the Council that it is time for completion of ethics forms again. Fire Chief Ricky Phillips then reported that AFD will be starting spring fire hydrant testing. Also, recently AFD personnel participated in ISO meetings. Eric Hayes with Arab Park and Recreation stated that March 24th will be the City

Easter Egg Hunt with 4000 eggs being hid. Also, 45 baseball/tee ball teams with almost 500 kids are signed up for spring sports. Melissa Cook reported that she has spoken with Skipper Consulting and they expect to have Traffic Impact Study completed soon. She also reported that she and the Mayor and other representatives recently attended work place development meetings and saw several interesting things to implement. The Mayor then reported for Ms. Helen Stone that the City had picked up 85 bags of trash on 7 major roads in the City. Dameon Pittenger stated that the landfill is making headway on brush piles.

With no old or new business to address, Mayor Joslin then opened up the floor for public comment. Since no one sought recognition, Council Member Allen moved to adjourn the meeting. Council Member Hart seconded and all voted yes.
