THE PLANNING PROCESS

The Planning Process, quite simply, Consists of three key components:

TAKING STOCK – LOOKING AHEAD – MAKING PLANS

Taking stock, or *identifying the why*, is Reviewing what we have, in order to Make an assessment of existing conditions.

Looking ahead, or *identifying the who*, *what* and *when*, is the *Development of a consensus vision* for the community, And includes the four broad major goals as laid out in this report.

Making plans, or *identifying the how*, is the Determination of those strategies and activities That ultimately leads to the achievement of the goals.

A VISION FOR THE CITY OF ARAB

A group of citizens from a variety of interests, organizations and occupations, all gathered together at a sequence of strategic planning workshops to brainstorm, collaborate, and ultimately describe their desired community.

Their objectives are detailed in this report, and are strikingly similar to the mission statement on the following page. Together, the mission, goals and objectives describe a vision for the future of the City of Arab.

This group of citizens considered a selection of four broad major goals, and collectively were able to present ideas that could bring their vision to life. These four broad areas of attention are:


- Economic Development
