

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF
THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF ARAB, ALABAMA
JULY 5, 2022**

The City Council of the City of Arab, Alabama, met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. for its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, July 5, 2022, in Arab City Hall, the time and place scheduled for such meeting.

Mayor Bob Joslin called the meeting to order. Upon roll call, the following answered present:

Also present were Tony Willis (City Clerk), Katie Jones (Administrative Assistant), Rodney Edmondson (City Attorney), city department heads, representatives of the media, and the public.

Mayor Joslin declared a quorum present and opened the meeting for the transaction of business. Council Member Allen led the pledge of allegiance. The invocation was given by Council Member Miller.

The minutes of the June 20, 2022, regular meeting were approved by unanimous vote upon a motion made by Council Member Allen and seconded by Council Member Gullion.


The Mayor then moved on to staff reports. Arab Police Chief Shane Washburn reported on some issues with traffic signage at Main Street and 4th Avenue due to construction. Mayor Joslin then reported for the Street Department that both recent abatements have now occurred and an accounting of the cost would be forthcoming. Mr. Dameon Pittenger reported that the bulldozer was returned back in service at the landfill. Mr. Eric Hayes with the Arab Park and Recreation Department introduced Ms. Tabitha Daily as the new Historic Park Coordinator.

With no more staff reports or old business to address, the Mayor then moved to the first item of new business, a public hearing to discuss rezoning of 894 Fairview Drive parcel from NC to R-1. Mayor Joslin opened the floor for the public hearing. Mr. Frank Franklin reported that neither he nor any of his neighbors received notice regarding rezoning. Otherwise, he didn't have anything negative to say regarding the rezoning. Mayor Joslin indicated that only those person's who property was within the


required distance established by law were provided notice via mail. With no one else seeking recognition, the Mayor closed the public hearing.

Next, the Mayor then moved to the second item of new business, an ordinance to rezone 894 Fairview Drive parcel from NC to R-1. Council Member Allen moved to suspend the reading of the ordinance. Council Member Miller seconded and all voted yes. Council Member Allen moved to suspend the rules. Council Member Miller seconded and all voted yes. Council Member Allen moved to approve the ordinance. Council Member Stone seconded and all voted yes.

With no more new business to address, Mayor Joslin then opened up the floor for public comment. Since no one sought recognition, Council Member Allen moved to adjourn the meeting. Council Member Miller seconded and all voted yes.
